Daniel R. Boone, PhD, CCC-SLP



Dr. Boone is Professor Emeritus at the University of Arizona and former President of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA), holding both Fellowship and Honors of the organization. He is the author of 15 professional books, several book chapters and monographs, and over 100 refereed journal publications. Since the first publication of his voice text in 1971, he has been primarily identified by his writings in voice disorders and their remediation.
